Introduction

The UEFA 2008 football tournament finals are being hosted jointly by Austria and Switzerland. The health authorities are on high alert, determined that a proactive strategy to managing public health during the tournament, will prevent any major outbreak of disease. All surveillance activities have been increased and hospitals advised that any suspected outbreaks of infectious disease be reported immediately to the authorities. In support of the Austrian Health department, ECDC agreed to second an EPIET fellow to act as liaison between the two organisations. Unfortunately, just before the tournament started the EPIET fellow withdrew due to illness. With no time to find an alternative EPIET fellow and properly brief them, ECDC management took the decision to send a senior expert from the Preparedness and Response Unit, to act as the liaison officer.

Background

The first game kicked off at 18:00 CET on Saturday 7 June in Basel between one of the host nations, Switzerland, and the Czech Republic. Over the three weeks of the tournament, 16 teams from across Europe will compete in 31 games in 8 cities, with the final due to be held in Vienna on Sunday 29 June. By then nearly 2 million people will have visited the host cities to attend the games or just to experience the carnival atmosphere that this tournament has become synonymous with.

In group B of the tournament are the other host country, Austria; Croatia, Germany and Poland. Their matches are being played in Vienna and Klagenfurt. These matches are expected to have a huge following, especially with the close proximity of Austria and Germany. To cope with the major influx of visitors and to maximise the number of beds available for fans, the local authorities in Vienna have rented a number of "Botels", floating hotels, and situated them on the Danube. Fan camps, low cost tented accommodation, have also been set up to provide an additional 3000 beds in the

suburbs.

The tournament itself got off to a slow start. The unseasonably heavy and prolonged rainfall in the days leading up to the start of the tournament and the losses by both host nations in their opening games created something of a dour atmosphere. Newspapers were full of horror stories about poor standards of accommodation, especially in the tented villages in Vienna, which became uninhabitable for three days, with people being temporarily housed in overcrowded emergency shelters. Fears were raised briefly about unsanitary conditions as a small outbreak of *Camplylobacter jejunii* was detected, but the prompt action of Viennese public health officials meant that this was rapidly contained and there were no other significant outbreaks of disease.

By Wednesday, 11th June things brightened considerably. The rain stopped and Switzerland narrowly beat Turkey. As the week continued, the weather continued to improve but the football, from the host nations, didn't. Both crashed out of the competition. On 16 June, in group B, Germany played Austria in Vienna and Croatia played Poland in Klagenfurt. Germany and Croatia both won, ensuring qualification to the quarter finals, whilst Poland and Austria prepared to return home.

Based on clinical diagnosis, the Austrian health authorities have identified 4 possible cases of meningococcal disease within the travelling supporters attending the 2008 European Championships. The cases are all in adult males, three from Germany and one from Poland. They are currently hospitalized, the three German citizens in a hospital in Vienna (one transferred from another hospital this morning) and the Polish citizen in the hospital in Klagenfurt.

The outbreak was brought to the attention of Austrian authorities by the Meningitis reference laboratory in Graz this morning, who overnight received samples from three separate receiving hospitals. Further analysis of samples is currently underway although confirmation is not expected until tomorrow (18/06).

We are currently awaiting further details and clinical information from the receiving hospitals of the cases and will provide that information as appropriate to others as it

Killer Bug Threatens European Football Championships

STAFF REPORTERS IN GRAZ-FOOTBALL fans attending the Euro 2008 competition in Austria are reported to be in hospital after coming down with the killer virus meningitis.

Doctors in two hospitals in Austria are reported to be treating fans from the tournament for the deadly disease which causes a stiff neck and a red rash – and which can kill in hours.

Official statements are still awaited from the European health authorities but eyewitnesses at a hospital in Graz have reported several "very sick"

fans admitted whom doctors are treating as cases of meningitis.

One hospital worker, who did not wish to be named, told us: "It's really very

VIENNA (I.N.) – An outbreak of meningitis could be latest in a string of difficulties to hit the crisis-prone Euro 2008 football competition.

The competition, taking place in Switzerland and Austria this month, is only halfway through and has already had to contend with terrible weather conditions, temporary camps having to be abandoned after turning into mud baths and reports of conditions in



emergency shelters reminiscent of scenes in New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina.

Now a new threat could be stalking the football fans spending a miserable holiday in Europe – the potentially deadly virus meningitis. Reuters staff in Vienna are reporting that several fans are in hospital with a mystery illness, which is being investigated as possible meningitis.

The illness – which usually affects school children and students living together in close conditions – is known for causing a stiff neck, dislike of bright lights and a distinctive red rash.

No confirmation has been yet received from the Austrian authorities and more information on the risk for fans is awaited from European health chiefs.

This is the ECDC liaison officer, calling from the Health Department in Austria. I have now received further information on the four cases of suspected meningococcal disease in Austria.

Case 1: male 36 years old. Polish citizen from Lodz believed to be attending European football championship. Admitted to hospital in Klagenfurt 2 days ago (15 June) with suspected meningococcal septicaemia and presenting with a petechial rash and difficulty breathing. In intensive care. Being treated with intensive regime of antibiotics.

Case 2: male 19 years old. German citizen from Munich also attending European football championship. Admitted to hospital in Vienna 2 days ago (15 June) with suspected bacterial meningitis. Symptoms: Severe headache, vomiting, stiff neck. Since hospitalization has developed petechial rash. Being treated with intensive regime of antibiotics.

Case 3 male 32 years old. German citizen from Munich believed to be attending European football championship. Admitted to hospital in Vienna 2 days ago (15 June) with suspected meningococcal septicaemia and presenting with a petechial rash, difficulty breathing and delirious. In intensive care. Being treated with intensive regime of antibiotics.

Arrived at hospital with case 2.

Case 4 male 27 years old. German citizen from Dusseldorf attending European football championship. Admitted to a 2nd hospital in Vienna yesterday (16 June) with suspected bacterial meningitis. Presenting with severe headache and stiff neck. Being treated with intensive regime of antibiotics.

The diagnosis is based on the clinical picture and initial results (biochemical and blood test results only but not microbiology. Microbiological and PCR confirmation will be received tomorrow morning at the earliest.

The Austrian authorities are expressing some concern that 3 of the 4 cases have developed septicaemia and the age distribution is unusual for this disease in two of the cases.

Public health officials have been dispatched to the hospitals in question to interview the patients to aid contact tracing. Additional case finding has also been instituted.

A German footballer, Robert Hoof, developed suspected meningococcal septicaemia, based on clinical symptoms, overnight and subsequently died in the early hours of this morning. The media are aware that a footballer has died of a mystery illness and that news is about to break. The Austrians have no evidence to suggest that this case of meningococcal disease is related to the others identified yesterday but it is a strong coincidence. There have been more cases of suspected meningococcal disease overnight but I do not have any detail yet. I will provide further information later as it becomes available and I expect Austria to provide an update on EWRS shortly.

Tragedy hits Euro football

THE crisis facing European football deepened today with the announcement of the sudden death of one of the stars of the Euro 2008 football tournament.

The tournament has been hit by difficulty from the very beginning two weeks ago, with reports of terrible conditions in mass camps set up for visiting fans, followed by torrential rains, thunderstorms and unseasonally cold temperatures.

There were also unconfirmed reports in some media yesterday of fans attending the tournament falling ill with meningitis.

But during the night, Euro 2008 organisers were confronted with real tragedy with the sudden death of 28-year-old Robert Hoof, one of the stars of the German national team.

The footballer had been due to play in yesterday's Group B game but was unexpectedly withdrawn from the German line-up, just hours before kick-off. Speculation before the game ranged from a stomach upset to the results of over-exuberant celebrations, following Hoof's winning goal which put Germany through to the latest round of the tournament the previous day. There were even suggestions of foul play in some European media. However, Hoof is understood to have been rushed to hospital in Austria, one of the host nations, late last night.

A hospital spokesman in Vienna said early this morning: "We are very sorry to have to announce the death of Robert Hoof at the hospital early this morning. Mr Hoof was admitted to hospital late last night but his condition deteriorated rapidly after his admission. Despite the very best efforts of the medical team, we were unable to resuscitate him and his death was confirmed at 4.42am. Tests are ongoing into the cause of death and we are unable to confirm any further details at this time. Our thoughts are with Mr Hoof's family and friends and his team-mates at this very sad time."

Despite a lack of information from official sources, speculation is rife among fans and reporters at the tournament around Mr Hoof's sudden withdrawal from the German team, followed rapidly by his unexplained death.

A number of fans attending the tournament are known to have been taken ill in recent days and there were reports in some media yesterday that several may have been suffering from the deadly bug meningitis.

The German Sports Ministry issued a brief statement through a spokesman this morning, saying the entire nation was devastated at the loss of one of football's brightest stars, just as his career was at its height.

No comments were available from European health sources.

A German footballer was admitted to hospital in Vienna late last night. The footballer was admitted at 11pm last night (17 June). Unfortunately the patient's condition deteriorated rapidly and within 6 hours he died. The suspected cause, based on clinical diagnosis, was meningococcal septicaemia. This was confirmed by clinical diagnosis and samples taken and sent to the meningitis reference laboratory in Graz which had been put on high alert since yesterday's discovery of four potential cases. We now await confirmation of the cause by the reference laboratory.

The morning newspapers and other media have learned of the death and are reporting it as an unexplained death.

Following our request for hospitals to increase their case finding activities another 8 cases of suspected meningococcal disease have been discovered overnight. We are awaiting further details of these cases.

All four cases below have now been confirmed with the same strain of *Neisseria meningitidis* B by the reference laboratory in Graz.

Case 1: male 36 years old. Polish citizen from Lodz.

Due to the severity of the disease, an interview with the patient has been impossible so no further details available

Case 2: male 19 years old. German citizen from Munich. Travelling with case 3 and originally attended hospital only to bring his friend into the ED.

Has been in Austria since 8 June and has been to all of Germany's games. Travelling with friends on an official tour organized by german football team. Arrived in Klagenfurt on 8 June and spent 5 nights at the fan camp in the centre of Klagenfurt, occupying a bunk in a room with 20 others of mixed nationality but principally German, Croatian and Polish (the camp is providing 1300 beds on a no reservation basis). Travelled to Vienna on Saturday, 14 June. Has been staying in a Camping in West tented village in the Hutteldorf suburb of Vienna with his friend and 5 others. (The camp site is providing 3000 beds and is open to all nationalities on a no reservation necessary basis). In all 30 people are travelling on the coach and the Austrian authorities are carrying out contact tracing of these.

Case 3 male 32 years old. German citizen from Munich.

Due to the severity of the disease, an interview with the patient has been impossible so no further details available. However, arrived at hospital with case 2.

Case 4 male 27 years old. German citizen from Dusseldorf. Travelling independently and arrived in Vienna on Thursday 12 June. Has been staying in tented villagen a Camping in Wien in the Hutteldorf suburb of Vienna sharing facilities with a group of Polish fans. Polish fans left on Sunday 15 June to travel to Klagenfurt for their next game. Spent the following days socializing with a group of German fans. Taken ill on morning of 16 June but originally thought it was a hangover.

Further cases of meningococcal disease

Following the request to hospitals to be vigilant for further possible meningococcal disease cases we have just been informed of a further 8 cases of possible meningitis and septicaemia, 6 cases in Vienna and 2 in Klagenfurt.

The breakdown is as follows:

Vienna -

5 Germans male age range 16 to 32.

- Two were travelling as part of the organized tour with cases 2 and 3 reported previously and therefore have the same travel history;
- two were independent travellers who have been travelling together and arrived in Vienna on Saturday 14 June from Cologne. They have been staying in the fan camp tented village in Hutteldorf since their arrival.
- 1 whos travel history is unknown (currently in Intensive care with bacterial septicaemia)
- 1 Austrian female age 18. Lives in the Viennese suburb of Hutteldorf. No recent travel history and has not attended any of the football games.

Klagenfurt -

- 2 Polish males ages 27 and 34
 - Independent travellers who have been travelling together and arrived in Klagenfurt from Vienna on Friday 13 June. Staying in a hotel on the outskirts of Klagenfurt. When in Vienna they do not remember the name of the place they stayed in but said it was a large campsite on the outskirts. They were there for three nights (10-12 June), having previously been in the same

hotel in Klagenfurt prior to that, arriving there from Warsaw on 7 June.

Molecular analysis of the Neisseria meningitidis strain.

We also have some scientific information we thought you may be interested in:

In parallel to the typing activities being conducted by the bacteriology laboratory at the Meningitis reference laboratory, a team of molecular microbiologists have been examining the strain by PCR. They noticed one of the PCR products was larger than expected for any known strain of meningitis and had its DNA sequence established. This confirmed the presence of an insertion sequence between the *sia* and *ctrA* genes. The implications of this are not yet clear but a similar phenomenon associated with a serogroup type C strain of *N meningitidis* emerging in Spain last year has been seen before. This strain was hypervirulent due to its ability to overproduce capsule.

We are sharing this information with ECDC in the hope that it may shed light upon the strain of *Neisseria meningitidis* Group B we are dealing with and whether it can help inform additional control measures to be taken

The Health department of the Austrian Government formally request the assistance of the ECDC in supporting our Public health teams with the control of the current outbreak of Group B meningococcal disease.

Objectives

 In particular we need expertise to further support our outbreak investigation teams as we do not have enough trained staff to maintain the current level of effort for very long.

Duration

We expect the mission to last for up to 4 weeks but this will be dependent on progress against the outbreak and could be shorter. The mission should begin as soon as possible to maximise the value of ECDCs expertise and input.

Contact point

The contact point in the health ministry will be through your liaison officer who will approach the appropriate contacts within the ministry to assist with all logistical arrangements for this mission.

EWRS Comment

Message Content: Early Warning - Level 2

Message:

Based on clinical diagnosis, the Romanian health authorities have identified a possible case of bacterial meningitis within the travelling supporters who have just returned from the 2008 European Championships. The case is adult male, age 27, currently hospitalized in the emergency hospital of Bucharest. He has typical clinical symptoms of bacterial meningitis, with headache, dislike of bright lights and stiff neck. We are analyzing the samples to confirm this diagnosis and have informed hospitals and other health facilities to increase their vigilance.

He travelled independently from Bucharest and arrived in Zurich on 8 June. He stayed for a week in Zurich with friends, watching the first two Romanian games and then travelled by train back to Bucharest via Vienna where he spent 3 nights in Vienna, staying in the fan camp Wien West tented village in Hutteldorf, Vienna. He arrived back in Bucharest overnight and presented at hospital this morning. Due to increased surveillance activities we were immediately informed.

Under IHR, we have informed the WHO.

We would appreciate any help, advice and support from others should this prove more than an isolated case.
